Item 4

Rhuddlan Town Council – Minutes of meeting held on 8th February 2018.

PRESENT

Cllrs. Andy Smith (Mayor in the Chair), Jackie Burnham, Ann Davies, Reg Davies, Heather Ellis, Syd Gaskin, Mike Kermode, Arwel Roberts, Gareth Rowlands and Gareth Smith.

3 members of the public were present.

2. DECLARATION OF INTEREST

Cllr Ann Davies – Member of County Council Planning Committee.

3. POLICE MATTERS

The Town Clerk read out the incidents that had happened since the last meeting:

16/01/18	Burglary Clos Y Berllan – investigation ongoing
17/01/18	Burglary Dwelling Highlands Road – Investigation ongoing
18 & 19/01/18	Suspicious incidents reported of persons seen in area, possibly linked to burglaries
19/01/18	Shoplifting Aldi – Investigation ongoing
26, 27 & 28/01/18	Making off without payment for fuel Texaco – Investigation ongoing
30/01/18	Theft from vehicle Glyn Avenue, Princes Park & Clwyd Avenue – Theft of tools from van – Investigation ongoing
07/02/18	Making off without payment for fuel Texaco – Investigation ongoing

Across the Denbighshire Coastal and Abergele area there has been an increase in theft from vehicles and burglaries (some of which are reflected in the incidents listed for Rhuddlan) and we have been tasked to patrol these areas in particular.

With regards to “recent incident” in the bowling green referred to in the minutes of January 11th (Item3) PCSO Rebecca Evans is aware of incidents at Rhuddlan Bowling Green having been made aware of by Cllr Arwel Roberts and Cllr Gareth Rowlands. PCSO Rebecca Evans has been in contact with two members of the public who have also passed information and the area has been frequently patrolled as part of our patrol plan.

4. COMMUNITY NAVIGATOR

Alex Pendleton, gave an overview of the project which is an initiative by Denbighshire County Council facilitated by voluntary groups - Age Connect and British Red Cross. The aim of the project is to support anyone over the age of 18 who needs help. Examples of situations were given; a carer who needs additional help at home can be signposted by the Community Navigator to the right agency who can offer support. Someone who is lonely can contact the Community Navigator who can signpost people to the right agency who can provide access to local social groups. Alex Pendleton gave examples (attached) to the Town Clerk who can forward to members.

Alex gave a brief overview about Talking Point, which is a single point of access for someone who needs help with daily life or would like support to access local social groups. Talking Point is run in Rhuddlan Library and One Stop Shop every Wednesday.

The Men-Shed initiative was discussed. This is an Australian concept that has come over to the UK. which provides men who are socially isolated with opportunities to take part in such activities such as woodwork, metalwork or just drop in for a cup of tea and socialize. There are 40 Men-Sheds in Wales and there are projects in Rhyl, Prestatyn and Abergele. Men-Sheds are self-run, through grants and charitable donations.

THE SILENT SOLDIER CAMPAIGN

This item was not scheduled to be discussed at the Town Council. Richard Kendrick, Poppy Appeal Organiser approached the Mayor before the meeting to ask if he could give a brief presentation on the Silent Soldier campaign by the British legion to which the Mayor agreed. Richard Kendrick gave a brief background of the Silent Soldier campaign which is to install a silhouette of a Silent Soldier in cities, towns and communities to commemorate the first World War troops. The cost is £250 per silhouette. There are no planning implications and the installation can be overseen by Richard Kendrick. **It was resolved** that this matter is to be put on the next agenda.

5. MINUTES

The minutes of 11th January 2018 (attached) were approved subject to minor changes.

Matters Arising:

(a) No dog Signs - Dogs do not have to be on leads anywhere in Denbighshire other than on the promenade at Rhyl to Prestatyn. However, dogs must always be under control.

Dogs are prohibited totally from being on any sports area that is maintained with white lines or burnt lines. The intention is that those who play on the areas are protected from coming into contact with dog foul or its residue.

(b) Castle lights - Three electrical contractors have expressed an interest in submitting a tender to carry out the job for lighting the Castle.

(c) Radar Gun - This has now been ordered and will be delivered early week commencing 12th February 2018. It was resolved that this be handed to the Community Speedwatch Co-ordinator.

(d) Defibrillators - The defibrillators have been installed. One outside the Police Station and the other outside the New Inn. A course has been arranged on how to use the defibrillators on the 19th February at 7 p.m. The Town Clerk to promote the defibrillators in the press and Rhuddlan Magazine.

(e) Bus Shelters - The frequency of cleaning the bus shelters would be decided by the Town Council. The Town Clerk is waiting for confirmation from Denbighshire County Council with regards to cost and launch of the service.

(f) Litter on Gwindy Street - This has now been cleared

(g) Boat Slipway - The Town Clerk will take photos of the exact location of the slipway to accompany a letter to be sent to Denbighshire County Council.

(h) Rhuddlan Cemetery - Denbighshire County Council are aware that the ground conditions in Rhuddlan cemetery are poor at the moment but unfortunately, due to the amount of rain the ground is just saturated. It's not only Rhuddlan Cemetery that has issues, there are problems in all Denbighshire County Council cemeteries this winter with water-logged ground. As soon as the ground starts to dry out. County Council Officers will assess and attend to any remedial work that needs doing in the areas.

(i) Bin on Princes Road to Plas y Brenin / Bin on Greville Avenue to Banquet House - Town Clerk to follow up on the cost of having bins emptied should the town Council go ahead with purchasing bins. A Service Level Agreement will need to be agreed.

(j) Bus Shelter – opposite the King's Head – The shelter has sustained some damage after the high winds. Cllr Arwel Roberts to contact Denbighshire County Council.

(k) The Luncheon Club – This starts on 23rd of February at 11 a.m. in Rhuddlan Community Centre. Cost is £4. Everybody welcome.

(l) Gas Marker Post (near Rhuddlan Gold Club Roundabout) – is in a sorry state and could be a safety issue for residents. The marker posts needs reinstating. Cllr Arwel Roberts to follow up with the County Council.

(m) Commuted sums – The applications for the Fresh Air Gym has been successful. There is a small shortfall. Denbighshire County Council will soon send a letter to confirm exact amount.

6a. The Mayor

The Mayor has received a request from a member of the public requesting if the Town Council could give recognition to a very remarkable character, Peter Robinson who was born and bred in Rhuddlan and has dedicated 40 years as a volunteer for the RNLI. Members agreed that Peter Robinson needs acknowledging. **It was resolved** to have an item on the next agenda to decide how Peter Robinson is to be acknowledged. The Town Clerk to write to members to ask for ideas on how to do this.

6c. Denbighshire County Council

Correspondence received from Street Lighting Section, Denbighshire County Council (attached) with regards to a bollard on the High Street obstructing entry to be able to put lights on the Christmas tree. **It was resolved** to replace the bollard with one that can be dropped/lifted out. Rhuddlan Town Council to pay for it. Town Clerk to make enquiries about prices.

6d. Dog Fouling - Ysgol y Castell

Correspondence received from Mr Gareth Van Heerden (attached) complaining about dog mess around the vicinity of Ysgol y Castell and Admirals Fields. This issue is clearly a County Council matter. **It was resolved** that the correspondence from Mr Gareth Van Heerden be forwarded to Tim Wynne Evans in Denbighshire County Council. The Town Clerk to reply to Mr Gareth Van Heerden informing him of the resolution. It was noted that there is a dog warden in Rhuddlan 5 times a week and patrols have increased. One person has been fined £100 in Admirals Playing Fields. Had the dog owners refused to pay, the incident and the dog owners name would become public knowledge.

6e. Review panel

Correspondence received from Welsh Government (attached) with regards to Independent Review Panel events being held across Wales to share and update Town and Community Councils on the matter. **It was resolved** that Cllr Mike Kermode represent the Town Council at the event to be held in Wrexham, March 7th.

6f. Community Transport

Correspondence received from the Project Manager of the Foryd Centre (attached) in Rhyl stating that they have extra capacity for one day per week for providing community transport e.g. taking people to doctor's appointments, shopping, and social trips. **It was resolved** to support this request. The Town Clerk to reply to the Project Manager and supply a list of those organisation who could benefit from the service e.g. Stroke Club, Community Navigator, Rhuddlan Community Association (Luncheon Club).

7. COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBERS REPORT

Cllr Ann Davies

a. CARERS CHAMPION

I am delighted to be reappointed as Carers Champion on behalf of DCC. There is a massive burden of responsibility on the shoulders of Carers, who come from all walks of life and often feel lonely and isolated but get on with what is a vital task. There are thousands of adult and child Carers in Wales and the numbers are increasing. We must ensure support and information reaches all Carers who also need to be looked after.

b. CARER AND CARED FOR EVENTS ARE HELD THROUGHOUT DENBIGHSHIRE.

c. RHUDDLAN SURGERY

I attended a meeting with the health board to discuss the following issues raised by residents. Why patients have to travel to Prestatyn for a blood test. Difficulty in booking an appointment at Rhuddlan surgery. Whilst I was assured blood test should be done at Rhuddlan surgery it was explained that there have been staffing issues and difficulty recruiting both GP's and Nurses locally.

d. RIGHTS OF WAY

I have raised concerns regarding the conditions of footpath stiles in Rhuddlan and the difficulty some people may have using them. I'm told that stiles are high on the list for upgrade to kissing gates, hopefully this work will be done within this financial year using Welsh government grant funding.

Cllr Arwel Roberts.

a. Very pleased that the work on the flood defences in Rhuddlan is progressing at last. Lately I have walked along the river Elwy – reported the fact that trees are left in the water – broken and nearly detached from the river's bank. Reported to Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru and County officers.

b. Also pleased that I'm now the Learning Disabilities Champion within Denbighshire County Council.

c. West Rhuddlan is a worry as the Aldi supermarket is developed – Marsh Road – litter – complaints from business owner and a resident. More bins needed in the area. The new traffic lights area is a worry – Yellow box lines nearly not present, same with the white lines on Station Road and Marsh Road. County officers are aware and they are confident that the money will be found to solve this problem.

d. Walked along the road to Llanelwy. Amount of litter on the A525 is a disgrace – have reported this to the Street Scene Team.

e. Thieves have been busy in the town including on the Crown Bard site.

f. Pleased as Chair of the i-beacon sub-group that it is developing well – thanks to Jo. Danson, Sian our Clerk, Cllrs Gareth Rowlands and Reg Davies and the Chair of the History Society Mr David Thomas.

g. Hopefully a book relating to Philip Jones Griffiths through the medium of Welsh will be launched in the Library on the 19th of March.

8. BLODEUO

Cllr Gareth Rowlands and Mrs Nerys Rowlands attended the Britain in Bloom 2018 launch in Birmingham on the 1st of February and attended two workshops (i) Portfolio and Judging Workshop (ii) Communication and Social Media. The main focus for Rhuddlan is to improve on last year's scores which will help gain those vital extra points. The judging day is 2 hours plus 15 minutes for presentation and 15 minutes for the press. The Wales in Bloom will take place the first two weeks in July and the Britain in Bloom will take place the first two weeks in August. The results will be announced in October. The Wales in Bloom launch will take place in Beaumaris on 16th March 2018 and the results will be announced in September and October.

Cllr Gareth Rowlands and Cllr Arwel Roberts had an interview with Sian Cothi on BBC Radio Cymru which provided excellent media coverage.

A Blodeuo working group has been arranged for the 20th February, 7 – 8 p.m.

9. INFORMATION & WEBSITE MATTERS.

A working group is to be held on 20th February to review the website, 8 – 9 p.m.

10. PLASTIC FREE RHUDDLAN

Cllr Gareth Rowlands gave an overview (attached) in the merits of signing up to a water bottle refill project which aims to reduce the amount of plastic in the community. Effort needs to be made to raise awareness in the community to cut down on plastic and help protect our environment. This will be a long-term process. **It was resolved** to support this initiative and to promote widely.

11. XMAS LIGHTS FOR 2018

Members discussed a report (attached) looking at option for the provision of Xmas Lights in the future. **It was resolved** to go with option A (same style lights and colour) and sign up for one additional year at a discounted price of 25%.

12. CCTV.

Cllr Gareth Rowlands delivered a report (attached) which provided an update on the future of CCTV in Rhuddlan which is to be operated by Chester and Cheshire West. £110K has been spent on modernising the system. The money was provided by Prudential Borrowing from Denbighshire County Council. Chester and Cheshire West are in the process of drafting a Service Level Agreement. **It was resolved** to invite Emlyn Jones and a representative from North Wales Police to outline how effective the CCTV cameras have had/ will have in the area. The Service Level Agreement will not be signed until the Town Council is satisfied that the CCTV are worthwhile in Rhuddlan.

13. TOURIST DIRECTION SIGNS FOR THE VALE OF CLWYD

Cllr Gareth Rowlands delivered a report (attached) in which he and Cllr Arwel Roberts attended a meeting with Ann Jones AM to discuss this project which is gathering momentum. There has been a lack of clarity from Denbighshire County Council with regards to the cost of this project. The total cost will be approximately £130 – £155K which includes contingency costs. Rhuddlan Town Council along with City of St Asaph, Denbigh Town Council, and Cathedral will be expected to contribute approximately £7k - £10k each towards this project. The costs to Rhuddlan Town Council is considerably less than previously anticipated. The new sum is very fair and will promote Rhuddlan as a desirable destination to visit. **It was resolved** to earmark £7K – 10K in 2019 -2020 budget/precept and that the Town Clerk write to Ann Jones AM to inform her of the Town Council's decision.

14. BUDGET/FINANCE MATTERS.

a. Accounts Due

Members approved the list of accounts (attached) due for February 2018.

c. Budget and Precept 2018/19

The Budget and Precept minutes (attached) on the 18th of January were circulated, considered and approved.

15. PLANNING MATTERS FOR COMMENT

Cllr Mike Kermode abstained from this item.

Cllr Ann Davies declared an interest.

Planning Application 44/2018/0028 (attached) – Erection of 1 no. dwelling with detached garage and construction of a new vehicular access (amended details previously approved under planning permission reference 44/2017/0072). Land adjacent to Castle Hill, Hylas Lane. There were no objections to this application.

16. URGENT COMMUNITY MATTERS – having been advised to the Mayor 24 hrs in advance.

a. The Mayor's Honour Board – has still not been amended. Town Clerk to follow up with Goodsigns and Print.

b. Admirals Playing Fields - Members were concerned about the state of the Admirals Playing Fields. Due to inclement weather and over-use of the pitch while wet, it has led to the field becoming water-logged and muddy. The field needs to dry out and will need spiking in April so that it is aerated which will help with the pitch being able to absorb water. **It was resolved** that the Town Clerk inform the Dragons Football Club that the pitch is not to be used until further notice.

c. Litter on KFC site – Members expressed concern about the amount of litter on site. **It was resolved** that the Mayor go and have an informal chat with management.

Rhuddlan Library and One Stop Shop

October – December 2017

This is the first quarterly report for Rhuddlan Library and One Stop Shop for the period October to December 2017. Due to the temporary closure of St. Asaph Library for refurbishment, it has proved a busier phase for Rhuddlan. Free bus travel has been arranged to transport library users from St. Asaph to Rhuddlan on presenting their library membership card. The Saturday morning opening hours have been temporarily transferred to Rhuddlan as well as the installation of two additional computers for digital queries/use. Thanks to the front-line staff at Rhuddlan Library for taking on the extra workload.

Bookstart Rhymetime for families with children 0-3 has successfully re-sited temporarily to Rhuddlan Library on a Monday afternoon too, with a total attendance of 135 children and 121 adults this quarter

During October Meira Jones was appointed Library and Customer Service Assistant Manager for Rhuddlan and St. Asaph. This follows the recent appointments within Denbighshire County Council of Bethan Hughes as Principal Librarian and Nia Wyn Jones as Library and Customer Services Manager at Rhyl and Prestatyn Libraries (maternity cover).

Working in Partnerships

Your Talking Points - Supporting independence and well-being, Talking Points is a way for people to find out what help is available to support their health and well-being in their local area.

Talking Points meet at Rhuddlan Library every other Wednesday mornings, six sessions have been held to date, with a total of 19 people attending this quarter. Services attending included Vision Support, Homeless Prevention, Homestead Care and the Alzheimer's Society. By attending Talking points 17 citizens were prevented from being referred into

Social Services.

OPUS - The OPUS team supports unemployed people with support and interventions of suit their needs. They hold regular appointments at Rhuddlan Library with 26 arranged during this quarterly period.

Cymraeg i Blant - Story and Rhyme

Suitable for Welsh speakers, Non-Welsh speaking parents and fluent speakers, run by 'Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin'.

Free Sessions for babies 0-2 years held on Wednesday mornings, term time 10-11.00 a.m. these are popular and lively sessions. A total of 113 children and 105 adults attended the sessions during this period.

Weekly French classes arranged by the U3A with 10 attendees on average

Citizens Advice Denbighshire (CAD) - The team can support you on your journey to work, volunteering and training. CAD provide free, confidential advice to help you overcome your problems

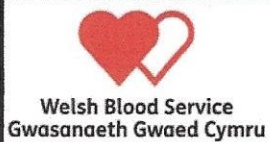

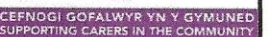

Dementia Friendly Communities

Background

On 19th February I attended an all-day workshop in Rhyl Town Hall organised by Ageing in Wales and the Alzheimer's Society. The main purpose was to celebrate the work being done in North Wales to be Dementia Friendly and to map out some steps for the future. Some 60 people attended the event and they came from a wide range of organisations and included a number of people living with dementia and a couple of carers.

It was a very informative day and showed the excellent work being done by town and community councils and others in North Wales; such as in Colwyn Bay, Rhos on Sea, Flint, Buckley and Beaumaris. These councils are making very positive steps on this matter.

Dementia Friendly Community Status

The town and community councils had either gained or are working towards the Alzheimer Society's "Dementia Friendly" status. This is a programme to help create dementia-friendly communities across the UK. It's wide ranging and covers everyone; from government agencies, councils, and health boards to the local corner shop and hairdresser. It helps them to see the contribution they can make to help people with dementia feel understood, valued and able to contribute to their community.

Rhuddlan Town Council

The Town Council had already made an important step in addressing the issue of dementia when it accepted Cllr. Arwel Robert's proposal to include £5,000 in 2018-19 for a Dementia Support Initiative. Working towards Dementia Friendly Community status will add more value and a wider dimension to our initiative.

The Town Council has been instrumental in helping Rhuddlan to gain Gold Awards in Wales in Bloom. Gaining Dementia Friendly Community status would be another major achievement for the Council in terms of the good work that it can do for the town and its residents.

Next Steps

The next steps towards Dementia Friendly Community status would be:

- Invite Jo Lane from the Alzheimer's Society to the next meeting of the Town Council to give a short presentation and question/answer session.
- Nominate a Lead Councillor/Dementia Champion.
- Setup a small Working Group.
- Organise a public meeting – this would have another session by Jo Lane and can also include some of the organisations that have already been in contact with Cllr. Arwel Roberts about dementia.

Item 7 – Special Award

At the last Town Council meeting on the 8th of February the Mayor received a request from a member of the public requesting if the Town Council could give recognition to a very remarkable character, Peter Robinson who was born and bred in Rhuddlan and has dedicated many years as a volunteer for the RNLI. Members agreed that Peter Robinson needs acknowledging. **It was resolved to** have an item on the next agenda to decide how Peter Robinson is to be acknowledged. The Town Clerk to write to members to ask for ideas on how to do this.

Background on Peter Robinson

Peter was born and raised in Rhuddlan, Denbighshire, and has lived in Rhyl for 31 years. He started his journey as Diving Officer at Rhyl Sub Aqua Club for 14 years, becoming a 1st class diver in the BSAC and is currently the president of the Rhyl Diving Club.

In 1989 Peter joined the RNLI and became second Coxswain in 1993. Peter then took the helm of Rhyl Lifeboat Station becoming Coxswain from 1996 to 2010.

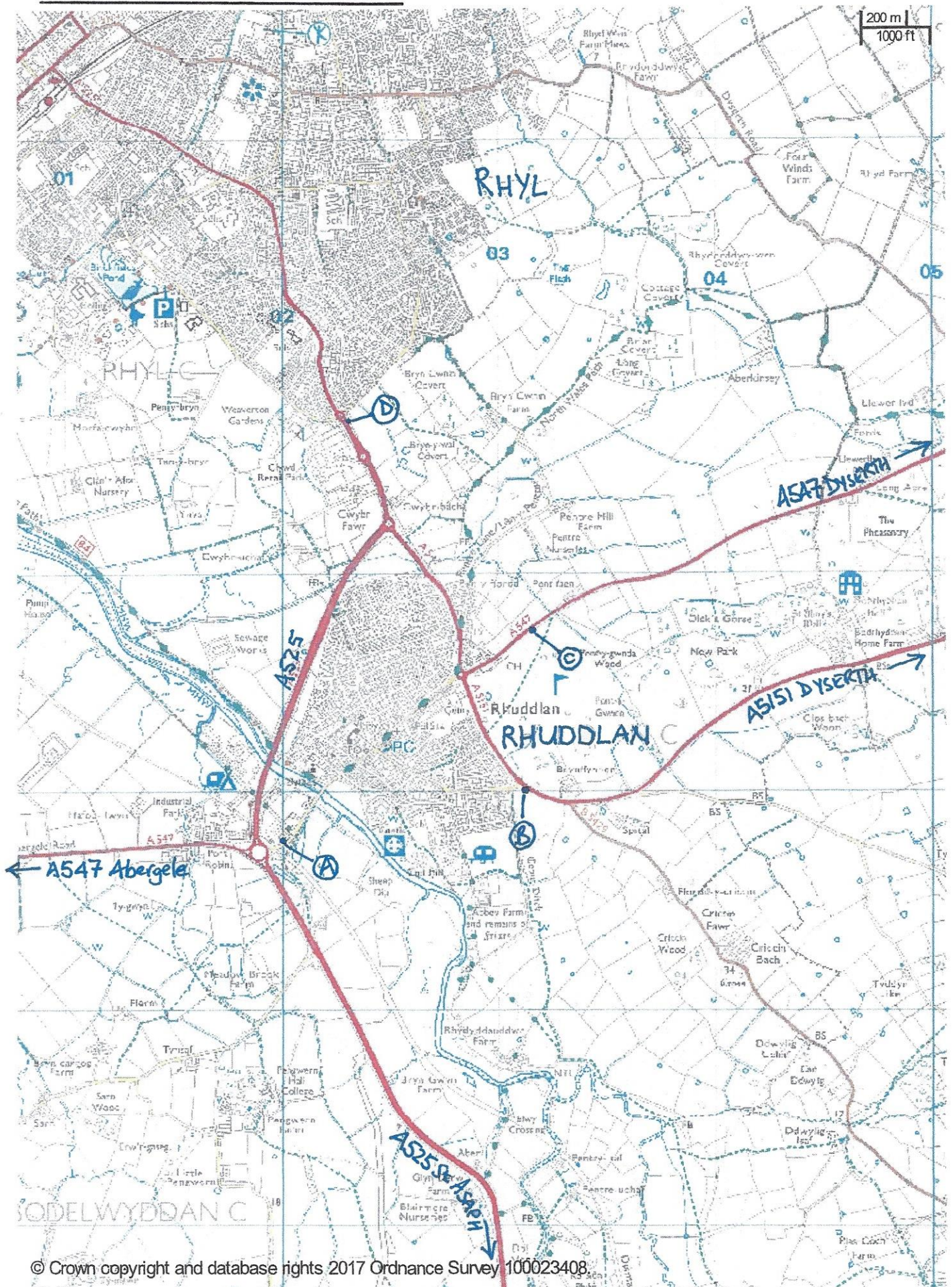
At the age of 60 Peter retired from the Coxswain position and began training the volunteer crew at Rhyl.

Peter has now fully retired from all sea going activities and has become a Deputy Launching Authority, authorising the launch of Rhyl RNLI's lifeboats, as well as undertaking talks in the community about the history of the station.

During his time as Coxswain, Rhyl Lifeboat Station was the busiest station in Wales for seven consecutive years, and was the busiest coastal lifeboat station in the UK & Ireland for one of those years.

As well as keeping busy for the RNLI, Peter has always been one to keep the community spirit in Rhyl high by organising events and keeping the town's clock in St Thomas's church wound up weekly.

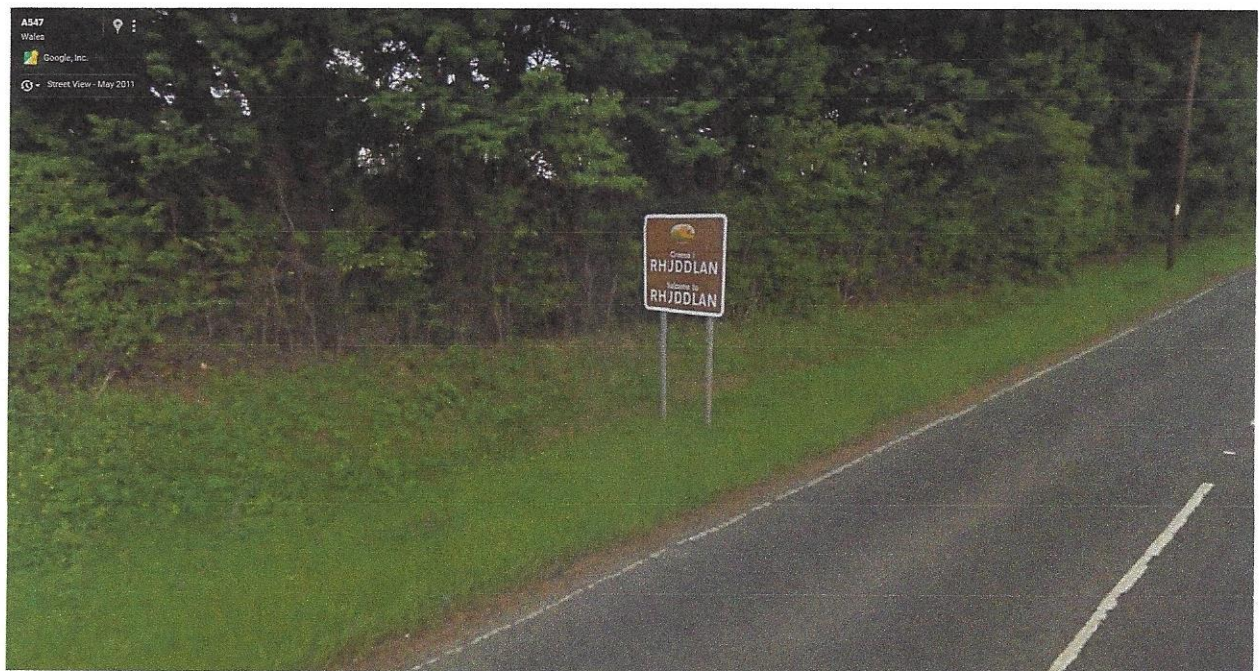

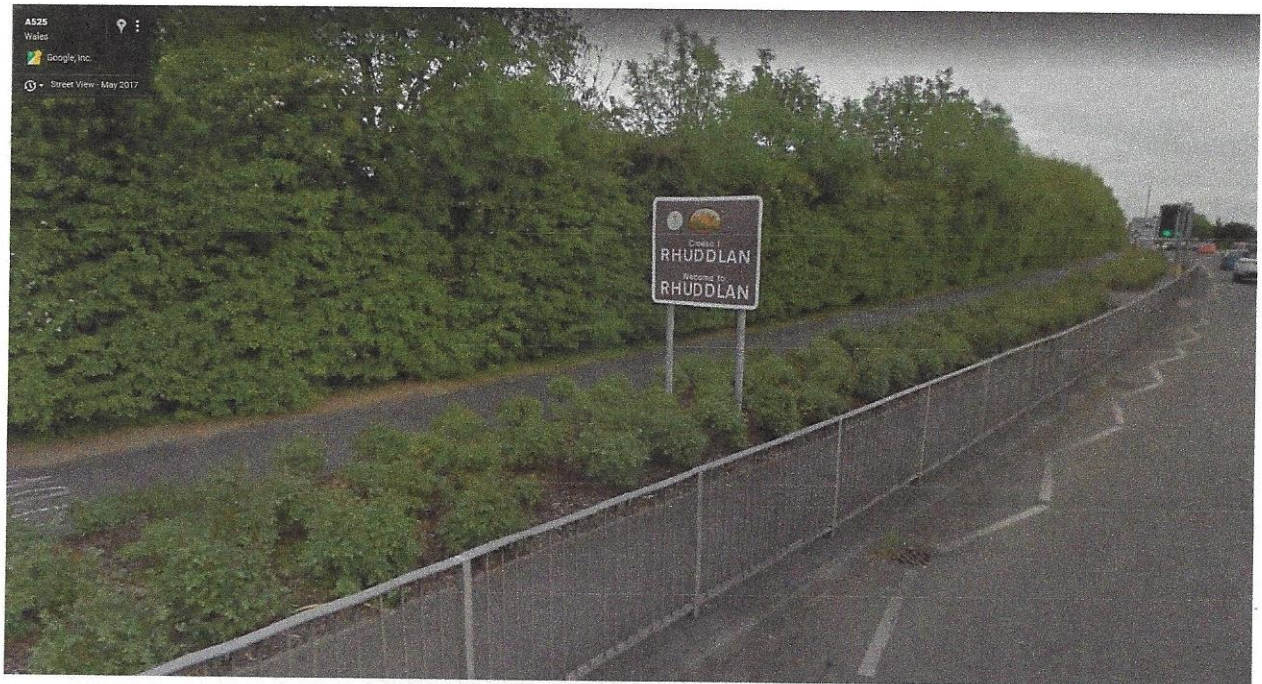

Rhuddlan TC wish for signs to be erected before judging visit in July.

Signs therefore to be up by around late May / early June.

Initial estimate is based upon erecting new signs (SIGN 1 or 2) on the existing posts below the "Rhuddlan" brown signs. [Cost 1]

Would like costs for adding "Thank you etc" sign (SIGN 3 or 4) to rear of "Rhuddlan" brown signs at same time. [Cost 2]

Issues that have arisen in early considerations.

Erection on existing sign posts

Due to amount of text suggested on SIGN 1 or 2, in order for the new sign to be a similar width to the existing brown sign, the text height on the new sign will be small. As a reference, the central "Blodeuo Rhuddlan Bloom" text would be similar in height to the "Croeso i / Welcome to" on the existing brown signs. [For Information – Road Sign text is to a standard font style – so cannot be changed to suit the size of the sign.]

We also need to keep the sign as small as possible due to the additional loading to the existing posts, especially the wind loading.

Erection on new posts

In order to provide larger text, and/or overcome wind loading, would need new larger sign posts. This has the knock-on issue of additional costs; difficulty with working space for a "JCB" to dig holes for new posts, especially for the sign adjacent to the "Table Table" that for safety reasons would probably require temporary traffic lights. (At this stage we are not sure whether these could be excavated using a mini digger rather than a JCB.) Furthermore, a larger "Blodeuo Rhuddlan Bloom" sign may not look right in combination with the existing brown sign.

A further issue that may increase costs is the type of post. If the new posts are over a certain diameter, they will need to be passive (collapse easily if hit by a vehicle). At the moment, I've not allowed for passive posts in the costs.

Costs for this alternative are listed as Cost 3 for SIGN 1 or 2, and Cost 4 for SIGN 1 or 2 with SIGN 3 or 4

Cost Estimates

For smaller signs on existing posts.

Estimate for Consultancy fee is £3000. However this fee may depend on how we can procure contractor.

Estimate for sign faces only is £500 - £750 for 4 (Sign 1 or 2), and £750 to £1000 for 8 (Sign 1 or 2 with Sign 3 or 4).

Maybe some additional costs for Prelims – say £500.

Meliden road may need Traffic Management (Stop & Go) while sign is erected. (outside 30mph) – potentially £450

Total estimate for Cost 1 is £4500, and Cost 2 £5000.

For larger signs on new posts.

Estimate for Consultancy fee is £3000. However this fee may depend on how we can procure contractor.

Estimate for removal of existing brown sign posts, fabricate new sign faces, and erect existing brown sign and new sign on new posts is £400 - £600 per sign, so for 4 = £1600 - £2400 (Sign 1 or 2), and £1850 to £2650 for 8 (Sign 1 or 2 with Sign 3 or 4).

Maybe some additional costs for Prelims – say £750.

Station Road, would probably require Traffic Management (Temporary traffic signals or Stop & Go) while post holes dug by machine – potentially £500

Meliden road may need Traffic Management (Stop & Go) while signs erected. (outside 30mph) – potentially £450

Total estimate for Cost 3 is £6500 and Cost 4 is £7350.

Note may be even higher due to possible requirement for passive posts.
